






#### 2. My child feels safe at school






3. The school makes sure the pupils are well behaved.





4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.














#### 10. The school lets me know how my child is doing.


# 11. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.







# We did...

No 6: A member of the Senior Leadership Team met with the parent about boys behaviour in Year 1. A short debrief session was put in place for the child this point referred to, to ensure they felt happy to speak up if they were worried about anything at lunchtime.

No 8: The school has a Care, Support, Guidance and Behaviour policy that is adhered to rigorously. In some instances, the policy needs to be adapted for children with special educational needs. If any families would like to discuss specific instances of behaviour, they can make an appointment to speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team via the main office. The policy is available on the school website www.smpa.org.uk

Staff sickness absence is currently a national concern as we navigate our way through a post-pandemic world. There have been some supply staff in school to ensure continuity in learning for children when staff have been absent due to sickness, this has been mostly support staff rather than class teachers. If there are specific issues in classes, please speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team via the main office.

No 11: Each class has 50 minutes for lunchtime, 25 minutes in the hall to eat and 30 minutes outside to play. Sometimes children get busy interacting with their friends and need to be encouraged to finish off their lunch. Any children who haven't finished eating are welcome to stay in the hall to finish whilst the rest of their class go out to play.

No 12: On Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> April we sent out a letter reminding parents about school uniform expectations and asking parents to avoid

football strips and brightly coloured PE clothes. School jumpers should be worn in all instances. Individual children will now be given spare uniform if their clothes do not meet the uniform requirements. For families who are struggling to meet uniform requirements due to the current financial crisis, please speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team who would be happy to support.

No 13: Homework menus are due to be given out in the first week of every half term. If individual children have not received theirs, please speak to a member of school staff who will be happy to help you. Our marking policy is light touch and feedforward. This means that books may only get a tick, but children will be given verbal feedback. Any areas for development will be fed forward into the next lesson not written in books. We also apply this policy in class exercise books. Our marking and feedback policy can be available to any parent who would like more information. Please request this at the school office.
